**[PROPOSED] ORDER GRANTING FINAL
APPROVAL AND JUDGMENT**

[PROPOSED] ORDER

The Motion of Plaintiff Ana Araujo (“Plaintiff”) for Final Approval of Class Action Settlement (“Motion”) came regularly for hearing before this Court. The Court, having considered the Class Action and PAGA Settlement Agreement (“Settlement Agreement”) between Plaintiff and Defendant Fidelity Health Care Center, Inc. (“Defendant” and together with Plaintiff, the “Parties”); having considered Plaintiff’s Motion, the supporting Memorandum of Points and Authorities and Declarations filed therewith; having granted preliminary approval of the Settlement and conditional certification of the Class for settlement purposes only; with due and adequate notice having been given to all Class Members as required in the Preliminary Approval Order, and good cause appearing, it is hereby **ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED AS FOLLOWS:**

1. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this action, the Parties, and the Class.

2. The Motion for Final Approval is **GRANTED**. The Court grants Final Approval of the Settlement upon the terms and conditions set forth in the Settlement Agreement, including the definition of the Class and Class Period stated below. The Court finds the Settlement terms are fair, reasonable, and adequate, pursuant to Section 382 of the California Code of Civil Procedure. For the reasons set forth in the Preliminary Approval Order, and in the proceedings of the Final Approval hearing, which are adopted and incorporated herein by reference, the Court finds that Plaintiff has satisfied the standards and applicable requirements for final approval under applicable law, including the provisions of Code of Civil Procedure section 382.

3. The Court certifies the following Class for the purpose of the Settlement only: Plaintiff and all other individuals who are or were employed by Defendant as non-exempt hourly-paid employees, who worked at least one shift in California during the Class Period. The Class Period is from December 15, 2019 through July 3, 2025.

4. The Court approves the following group of aggrieved employees under the Private Attorneys General Act of 2004 (“PAGA”) as: Plaintiff and all other individuals who are or were employed by Defendant as non-exempt hourly-paid employees, who worked at least one shift in California from October 30, 2022 through November 18, 2025.

1 5. The Court appoints Hengameh S. Safaei of North Law, P.C. as Class Counsel.
2 6. The Court appoints Plaintiff Ana Araujo as the Class Representative.
3 7. The Court appoints Apex Class Action LLC as the Settlement Administrator and
4 concludes the Settlement Administrator took all reasonable and necessary steps to locate and notify each
5 Class Member of the Agreement, as required in the Preliminary Approval Order. The notice given to
6 the Class fully and accurately informed the Class of all material elements of the Settlement Agreement
7 and their opportunity to object or comment thereon; was the best notice practicable under the
8 circumstances; was valid, due, and sufficient notice to all Class Members; and complied fully with
9 applicable law. The notice fairly and adequately described the Settlement and provided Class Members
10 with adequate instructions and a variety of means to obtain additional information. A full opportunity
11 has been afforded to Class Members to participate in this hearing. Accordingly, the Court determines
12 that all Class Members who did not timely and properly request exclusion are bound by this Judgment.

13 8. Upon the funding of the Gross Settlement Amount, all Class Members shall fully release
14 and discharge Defendant and each of its former and present directors, officers, partners, shareholders,
15 owners, members, attorneys, insurers, predecessors, successors, assigns, subsidiaries, affiliates, and
16 parents (the “Released Parties”) from all claims that were alleged, or reasonably could have been alleged,
17 based on the facts stated in the operative First Amended Complaint in the Action, including, but not
18 limited to, any and all claims involved any alleged failure to pay overtime wages; failure to pay
19 minimum wages; failure to provide meal premiums and/or unpaid meal period premiums; failure to
20 authorize and permit rest breaks and/or unpaid rest break premiums; failure to timely pay final wages;
21 failure to provide complete wage statements; failure to timely pay wages; and based on violations of
22 Labor Code sections 201, 202, 203, 204, 226, 226.3, 226.7, 510, 512, 558, 1174.5, 1194, 1197, 1197.1,
23 1198, applicable sections of the relevant Industrial Welfare Commission Wage Order(s), or Business
24 and Professions Code section 17200, et seq., which are premised on the same allegations, and applicable
25 Cal. Code Regs. (the “Released Class Claims”). The operative release period for the Released Class
26 Claims is the Class Period. Participating Class Members do not release any other claims, including
27 claims for vested benefits, wrongful termination, violation of the Fair Employment and Housing Act,
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1 unemployment insurance, disability, social security, workers' compensation, or claims based on facts
2 occurring outside the Class Period.

3 9. The Court finds that Class Members who did not timely exclude themselves from the
4 Settlement will be deemed to have released the Released Parties from the Released Claims, as set forth
5 in the Settlement Agreement. Class Members who did not timely object to the Settlement are barred
6 from prosecuting or pursuing any appeal of this Order Granting Final Approval.

7 10. The Court directs Defendant to fund the non-reversionary settlement amount of
8 \$550,000.00 in accordance with the terms of the Settlement Agreement. The GSA shall provide for
9 Class Members' individual settlement payments, the class representative service and general release
10 payment for Plaintiff, Class Counsel's attorney's fees and costs, the Settlement Administrator's fees and
11 expenses, and penalties to the California Labor and Workforce Development Agency and PAGA Group
12 Members pursuant to Labor Code section 2698 *et seq.*

13 11. Defendant shall fund and the Settlement Administrator shall distribute the Gross
14 Settlement Amount in accordance with the terms of the Settlement Agreement.

15 12. Pursuant to the terms of the Settlement, and the authorities, evidence and argument
16 submitted by Class Counsel, the Court hereby awards payment from the Gross Settlement Amount for
17 Class Counsel's attorney's fees in the amount of \$183,333.33 (one-third of GSA) and costs in the amount
18 of \$18,737.35, as final payment for and complete satisfaction of any and all fees and costs incurred by
19 and/or owed to Class Counsel. The Court further orders that the award of attorney's fees and costs set
20 forth in this paragraph shall be administered pursuant to the terms of the Settlement Agreement.
The fee award is appropriate in light of the benefit obtained for the class.

21 13. The Court approves the payment of a service award and general release payment in the
22 amount of ~~\$10,000~~ ^{\$7,500.00} to Plaintiff from the Gross Settlement Amount.

23 14. The Court approves and orders payment in the amount of \$50,000 from the GSA for
24 PAGA penalties, 75% of which will be paid to the LWDA and 25% of which will be distributed to the
25 PAGA Aggrieved Employees pursuant to the terms of the Settlement Agreement.

26 15. The Court approves and orders payment from the Gross Settlement Amount for actual
27 settlement administration expenses incurred by the Settlement Administrator, Apex Class Action LLC,
28 in the amount of \$6,790.

1 16. The Court approves and orders payment of individual settlement payments from the Net
2 Settlement Amount to the Settlement Class Members, as set forth in the Settlement Agreement. One
3 third of each Participating Class Member's Individual Class Payment will be allocated to settlement of
4 wage claims (the "Wage Portion"). The Wage Portions are subject to tax withholding and will be
5 reported on an IRS W-2 Form. The remaining two thirds of each Participating Class Member's
6 Individual Class Payment will be allocated to settlement of claims for interest and penalties (the "Non-
7 Wage Portion"). The Non-Wage Portions are not subject to wage withholdings and will be reported on
8 IRS 1099 Forms.

9 17. The Court approves and orders that any checks distributed from the GSA yet remaining
10 uncashed one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days after being issued shall be void. Following
11 expiration of the check-cashing period, the Settlement Administrator will remit these funds to the Legal
12 Aid At Work, Workers' Rights Clinic.

13 18. The Parties, their counsel, and the Settlement Administrator are ordered to administer the
14 settlement in accordance with the terms of the Settlement Agreement.

15 19. Pursuant to the Settlement Agreement, the Parties, their respective counsel, and all
16 Participating Class Members who did not object to the Settlement waive all rights to appeal from the
17 Judgment, including all rights to post-judgment and appellate proceedings, the right to file motions to
18 vacate judgment, motions for new trial, extraordinary writs, and appeals.

19 20. Without affecting the finality of this Judgment, the Court shall retain continuing
20 jurisdiction over this action and the Parties, including all Class Members, and over all matters pertaining

21 to the implementation and enforcement of the terms of the Settlement Agreement pursuant to California
22 Code of Civil Procedure § 664.62027. A non-appearance case review re the filing of the final report
is set for August 31, 2027.

23 **IT IS SO ORDERED. LET JUDGMENT BE ENTERED ACCORDINGLY.**
